Residents can drop off: leaves/ compost, metal and appliances, oil, tires, cardboard, batteries, and electronics. The cost for dropping off electronics is \$1 per pound starting January of 2022. - Record number of participants. We had over 1,000 (1,016) participants enrolled in youth recreation programming in 2021.
- Record number of participants in our Little League Program (497), Youth Soccer (137), Fall Baseball/Softball (297).
- Expanded our Youth Soccer Program from grades K4 2nd to now include 3rd 5th grades.

We are extremely fortunate to have Eric Ryer as our Town Administrator. He has been working the Town for 14 years in various roles and has earned two masters degrees. TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

Recent Grant Successes Save Tax Dollars

The Town has had great success in recent years in terms of grant applications. Two upcoming projects alone are saving the Town an estimated \$1.3 million.

Covered Bridge Road (2022)

The first project is the replacement of the traffic carrying portion of the bridge on Covered Bridge Road. The historic Covered Bridge itself will not be altered as part of the project, only the bridge that carries vehicles will be rebuilt. The total cost of the project is slightly more than \$1.03 million dollars. However, the Town applied for and was successful in obtaining a grant from the State of Wisconsin that covers 80% of the cost. That means the grant will pay for roughly \$827,000. This project is scheduled for the summer of 2022.

Columbia Road (2023)

A second significant project is the total reconstruction of the Town-owned portion of Columbia Road. This project is estimated to cost \$688,000, with the State of Wisconsin covering 70% of the project, or \$482,000 of that total. This project will repair the stretch of road from Keup eastward to just west of the service entrance for Sendik's. This highly traveled stretch of road has been repaired on a regular basis by the Town in recent years, adding to maintenance costs. The project is set be completed in 2023.

STH 181 (Wauwatosa Road) 2022: State Project


The State of Wisconsin DOT will be completing a mill and overlay of approximately 3 miles of road from the 5 Corners intersection south to Sycamore Drive, and then continuing south toward Pioneer Road. The project will renew the pavement surface, as the existing asphaltic pavement is showing areas of cracking and joint deterioration. This project will also rehabilitate drainage structures and replace guardrail within the project limits. During construction scheduled for the summer of 2022, traffic on WIS 181 will be closed to through traffic in segments within the project limits. Access to any businesses or residences along WIS 181 will be maintained at all

times during construction, and corresponding detours will be posted.

Stage 1: Close WIS 181 between County Road C (Pioneer Road) and County Road T (Western Avenue).

Stage 2: Close WIS 181 between County Road T (Western Avenue) and WIS 60.

This project will be completed at no cost to the Town, being a State project.

Comprehensive Plan Update

A Comprehensive Plan is a guide to a community's growth and economic development. The current Town plan was adopted on April 2, 2008, and went through minor amendments in 2009 and 2012. While the original life of the plan was intended to last to 2035, communities are now required to update their plan every 10 years. The state statute does not define what is required to be accomplished as part of the update, but it does provide the opportunity for communities to stay current with market conditions and resident needs.

The Town will be embarking on updating its Comprehensive Plan in 2022. This process is estimated to take about one year, and will provide the opportunity for public involvement.

The Town also has a more detailed plan for the 5 Corners area, fittingly called the 5 Corners Master Plan. This document, when paired with our design standards for new commercial, senior, institutional and government facilities, is meant to attract quality development. The standards work to provide for consistency in terms of appearance.

This Comprehensive Plan update will offer the opportunity for the 5 Corners Master Plan to be incorporated into the document, or updated separately and referenced. The goal of addressing both documents simultaneously is a more unified approach to development over the next 10+ year

OZAUKEE COUNTY PLANNING & PARKS

New Pavilion Building at Covered Bridge County Park

The Ozaukee County Planning and Parks Department is constructing a new pavilion building at Covered Bridge County Park. The building includes indoor bathrooms and an open-air picnic shelter designed by Kueny Architects, LLC and constructed by J.H. Hassinger, Inc. In addition, the County also paved Cedar Creek Road entering the park through a partnership with the Town of Cedarburg.

Covered Bridge County Park is a highly visited park in the Ozaukee County Park System and routinely hosts large groups and events, including weddings and bike rides. The park was previously serviced by a vault bathroom building; however, this bathroom building was in the 100-year floodway. As such, the WDNR required its removal (along with an existing flowing drinking water well). The new building location and drinking water well are now outside of the floodway.

CEDARBURG FIRE DEPARTMENT

Town of Cedarburg Fire Numbers

Being able to locate an emergency scene is one of the first links in the chain of providing service and medical care to those who need it. The Town of Cedarburg provides each property with a legible sign with its address numbers so that Fire, EMS and law enforcement can easily locate the property to which they were called. These signs are reflective so that they can be easily identified in both day and night. While Fire, EMS and



law enforcement utilize tools like maps and GPS, these signs ensure they are in the right place. Please make sure that your sign is in place at the end of your driveway and clearly visible from the road, and if it is missing or damaged, please contact the Town to have it replaced. We cannot stress the importance of these signs as they prevent a delay in life saving care and service to those who need it.

OZAUKEE COUNTY CONTINUED

Until now, the building provided three rental portable toilets, which were not adequate with increased park use, especially during large events. Also, a WDNR Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund grant that supported park acquisition and improvements required construction of a replacement public indoor bathroom. This project is expected to greatly enhance the Park user experience.

Construction activities are scheduled to be significantly complete by January 2022. The building design and colors have been selected to complement the architecture and colors of the historic Covered Bridge. The Department is accepting online building reservations for dates beginning in May 2022 (<u>https://www.co.ozaukee.wi.us/644/Parks-Recreation-Culture</u>). Town Board Approves 2022 Budget

On November 23rd, the Town Board approved a \$2.78 million general fund budget for fiscal year 2022. The Town tax rate does not increase, and more importantly, the budget enables the Town to continue to provide high quality essential services.

The 2022 budget consists of six funds, primarily funded by a property tax levy of \$1,828,989, a minimal increase of \$16,532 over 2021. The levy increase is directly attributed to the rise in assessed value from new construction. The increase in assessed value for 2020 for the Town was 0.88%, placing the Town squarely in the middle Ozaukee County communities for growth rate. The approved tax rate is \$2.49 per \$1,000 of assessed value. A home assessed for \$300,000 will pay \$750 in property taxes to the Town. The Town has a history of steady growth, with our focus ever-shifting toward long-term financial planning.

The 2022 budget dramatically increases road funding following a year long effort by the Finance Committee and Town Board to study and commit to a \$5 million Capital Plan. The 2022 portion of the Capital Plan includes \$1.5 million in road work. This amount is up from \$440,000 in road spending in 2021. Road projects will be bid out over the winter, with the goal of maximizing the number of roads being completed due to sheer volume of work being accomplished at the same time. The \$5 million Capital Plan financing will begin to be reflected on tax bills starting in December of 2022, increasing the tax rate by \$0.33/\$1,000 of assessed value.

The operating budget includes funding for maintenance of an additional 1+/- mile of roads. The Town will work with a contractor to complete the maintenance with an appropriate method such as a chip seal that will address surface issues, improve ride, and seal the pavement slowing the aging process. The budget also includes \$20,000 for ash tree removal in road rights-of-way.

In terms of capital equipment, the approved budget calls for a patrol plow truck (\$230,000), box truck with ramp for carrying smaller equipment to job sites (\$50,000), and new zero-turn mower (\$20,000). The upcoming year will also mark the beginning of the implementation of the newly established equipment replacement schedule that works to replace aging equipment at the appropriate time.



What Can I Burn?

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Although winter just began, spring will come before our next newsletter. It's important to remember what is authorized to be burned within the Town of Cedarburg. In the Town, it is unlawful to burn or bury solid waste and recyclables. Only clean wood (defined as any wood that has not been chemically treated in any way) and paper products and diseased vegetation can be burned. Please remember that burning green leaves, grasses, and other green vegetation not only affects your neighbors next door and down the street but is also illegal in the Town. Leaf smoke can irritate the eyes, nose and throat for healthy adults. It can be much more harmful to children, the elderly, and people with asthma or other lung or heart diseases. The Town offers a compost drop off at Town Hall for all leafy yard debris which residents can access weekdays 8am-4:15pm, and Saturdays when the yard is open.
