

Pee Wee Soccer Rules (K4-K5)



General Game Rules

1. All players are in K4 or K5 in the fall.
2. Field Size is 30 yards x 20 yards.
3. All games will be played using the yellow PUGG Pop up goals.
4. Four players from each team will be allowed on the field at a time. A minimum of 3 players will be needed to start a game.
5. Each team will play with 2 defenders and 2 forwards in each game. NO Goal Keeper will be used.
6. Games will consist of 4 quarters 8 minutes each with a continuous clock. There will not be an overtime if teams are tied at the end of the 4th quarter. There will be a 4 minute break in-between each quarter. The clock will only stop in the event of an injury.
7. All games will be played with a size 3 soccer ball.
8. There is no penalty for offside.
9. The team listed first on the schedule will kick off the 1st and 3rd quarters of each game; the team listed second on the schedule will kickoff the 2nd and 4th quarters of each game.
10. Teams will switch goals at halftime.
11. The team listed 2nd on the schedule will be the home team and will choose which direction they would like to play offense towards in the first half.

Playing Time

1. Each player will be required to play a minimum of two full quarters.
2. Players will play an entire quarter with substitutions coming at the completion of each quarter.
3. No player will sit 2 quarters in a row.
4. Players must play both forward and defense in each game.

Penalties/Out of Bounds

1. A ball must be completely over the sideline or end line to be considered out of bounds. A ball that goes out of bounds over the sideline will result in a throw in by the team that did not touch the ball last prior to going out of bounds. The throw in must be taken from the location that the ball went over the sideline. A legal throw in will consist of a player keeping both feet on the ground and with two hands throwing the ball from directly over the top of their head.
2. A ball that goes out of bounds over the end line will result in either a goal kick or a corner kick. If the defensive team kicks the ball out of bounds over their own end line the ball will be place in the corner of the field where the sideline meets the end line. The offensive team will then kick the ball in play to resume play. A ball the is goes out of bounds over the end line by the offensive team the ball will be placed on the corner of the goal box. The defensive team will then kick the ball in to resume play.
3. Players MUST stay on their feet at all times. Slide tackling will result in an indirect free kick by the opposing team.
4. Players may not use their hands when the ball is in play. If a player uses their hands or any part of their arms the opposing team will receive an indirect free kick from the spot of the penalty.
5. Pushing and shoving is not allowed. If a player pushes or shoves another player the opposing team will receive an indirect free kick from the spot of the penalty.
6. If a penalty occurs by the defensive team in their own goal box, the offensive team will receive a direct free kick (penalty kick) without a goalie. This kick will take place from the end of the goal box. The players currently in the game from both teams that are not making the kick will line up along the end of the goal box. The ball will be considered live once it is touched by the player taking the penalty kick.
